OUHSD is committed to providing enriching extra-curricular opportunities for our students, staff, and the community. To ensure a safe environment, [OUHSD Extra-Curricular Event Spectator Guidelines](#) were created that all of our staff, students, parents and community members must follow. Additionally, we have listed some Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) below to better inform our stakeholders:

1. Are spectators allowed at practices or competitions?

Yes, under the conditions outlined in the OUHSD Extra-curricular Event Spectator Guidelines linked above. Upon request by site administration, immediate household members must be prepared to provide proof of residency.

2. If Butte County goes into the Red Tier, football starts and then Butte County returns to the Purple Tier, can the sports that have started continue?

Yes

3. Is COVID testing mandated for student-athletes and/or coaches to participate?

As of the date of this notice, football is the only sport required to be COVID tested if the county adjusted rate is 7% or higher. If players are required to be tested, the District will work with Butte County Public Health to administer the weekly tests. Indoor sports are not currently approved.

4. If a coach or an athlete has been vaccinated, do they still need to test?

Yes. Per the most recent guidance from the California Department of Public Health, coaches and athletes must still be tested even if they have been vaccinated.

5. If an athlete or coach tests positive for COVID-19, how does the contact tracing and possible quarantining?

In the event of a positive test result, the process for contact tracing and quarantining mirrors the existing process in place for all students and staff attending our schools in-person. Coaches will be involved in identifying any potential players who may have been exposed.

6. If an athlete has previously tested positive for COVID-19, do they still need to be tested?

Yes

7. Who has to wear masks?

All participants* (staff, students, and officials**) and spectators must wear face coverings while on our campuses or at Harrison Stadium.

*Participants actively engaged in competition are NOT required to wear a face covering. However, when they return to the sideline, they are expected to re-cover their mouth and nose as quickly as possible.

**Officials must wear a face covering when in close proximity (4 feet) to student-athletes.
